

Emergent Notice

Member countries, board member units and cooperative institutions:

On Jan 12, 2010 at 16: 53, local time, the Caribbean nation Haiti was hit by a massive 7.3-magnitude earthquake, the worst in two centuries, which almost leveled its capital Port-au-Prince. Its power system, traffic and communication all failed. Three million people are feared affected and 200,000 dead. On this sad occasion, let's convey our condolences to the victims and send our heartfelt regards to their family.

The disaster almost paralyzed the central governmental command structure; the Haitians went all out to fight against it. People all over the world are concerned about the Haitians, and UN and many international organizations are already making active efforts to help the Haiti government and people go through this hard and sad occasion.

International Eco-safety Cooperative Organization is a global international organization committed to maintaining eco-safety, protecting eco-environment and addressing ecological crises and disasters. We closely follow the 1.12 Haiti earthquake, and IESCO presidium requests the related agencies of IESCO to make relief efforts and hereby issues the following notice:

I Member countries, board member units and cooperative institutions of IESCO should all lend a helping hand and donate goods or money. IESCO will send them to the affected area through ICRC.

II IESCO will assist in the rebuilding efforts of Haiti and will send staff there to help.

III IESCO plans to launch a post-earthquake recovery-aiding project in Haiti and raise fund to build a refugee resettlement and service center in the suburb of Port-au-Prince so as to ease the pressure on the city.
